Mosquito Spraying

The Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) sprays most municipalities in Lake County to reduce the risk of mosquito borne diseases and provide a more comfortable summer environment. For more scheduled & additional information, contact their hotline, at 440-350-2088 or visit lcghd.org.

Garage Sales

A permit is not required for a garage sale, but the city does restrict where signs can be placed. Garage sale signs are permitted only on the property where the sale is being held. They may not be posted at the street corner, on tree lawns, or utility poles. Illegally posted signs may be confiscated by city staff without prior notice.

Grass and Weed Control

Lawns and landscaping should be maintained so as not to cause a negative effect on the neighborhood. Generally, grass in residential neighborhoods must be controlled in height or growth (under 8"). Property owners with excessively high grass or weeds will be given notice by Mentor's Code Enforcement Office and have 48 hours from receipt of notice to cut the high grass or remove the weeds. If the notices are ignored, legal action will be pursued for City crews to cut the grass at the owner's expense. Call 440-974-5740 with questions.

in the City. Small outdoor firepits/ outdoor fireplaces are allowed but must not be used on an apartment balcony or within 10' of any structure. Recreational fires having a fuel area of 3' or less in diameter and 2' or less in height are permitted. No permit is required. Planning a bonfire (a fuel area of 3' or more in diameter)? You need a permit. To receive a bonfire permit, call the Fire Prevention Bureau at 440-974-5768 at least two business days before your planned bonfire.

HELP SHAPE MENTOR'S FUTURE

A comprehensive plan ("comp plan") is a guidebook for the city, looking 20 years or more into the future of land use and how the city should evolve. The last comprehensive plan was adopted by City Council in April 2011. The City of Mentor is excited to prepare an updated comp plan that will preserve what residents and businesses value, enhance what needs to be improved, and create opportunities that will address what the city is missing from a land use and zoning perspective.

The 2025 Comprehensive Land Use Plan Update will build on the Housing Study completed in 2024 and focus on an analysis of commercial and industrial zoned areas of the city where development or re-development opportunities exist. This review process will also factor in how current economic conditions will influence future development trends. This comprehensive review will result in the establishment of practical land use policy statements and goals and zoning code strategies that will guide development decisions for many years to come.

For the plan update to be successful, it must also be driven by the vision and values of the people that live and work here. There will be opportunities throughout this plan update for public engagement, from attending community open houses to completing an online survey. A steering committee has also been formed that is comprised of city leaders and community stakeholders who will offer guidance and participate in the plan review process.

MEET K9 ARES

The Mentor Police Department is deeply committed to using all tools at their disposal to help keep our community safe and K9 units are an integral part of that effort.

Officer Terry Wurgler has been with the department for 19 years and a K9 handler for the past 12. During that span, he was paired with K9s Titan and Achilles. Sadly, Achilles passed way due to an illness last year, but Wurgler was united with a new partner in April. We recently caught up with him during his rounds when he introduced us to K9 Ares.

What breed is Ares? He is a German Shepherd.

Where did Ares come from? Ares was born in Poland and sent to a facility in Pennsylvania where I trained with him for six weeks.

What attracts you to this breed? I love the fact that they are so intelligent, loyal, hardworking, and beautiful. I've been lucky to have worked with a German Shepherd and a German Shepherd/Malinois mix and saw great qualities in both.

How did you know he was the one? It came down to three dogs that I really liked and there was something special about Ares that drew me to him.

Can you tell us a little about his training? He's a dual-purpose K9 certified through the state of Ohio in patrol and special purpose. He's trained in the detection of narcotics (cocaine, heroin, and

methamphetamine), suspect apprehension, tracking, area searches, article searches, building searches, and most importantly, obedience.

After spending some time with him, what personality traits do you see shining through? Ares is very eager to please, he loves to work and train as well as play. He is very social and seems

to be chomping at the bit to get out and meet as many people as he can. We have been going through the department, dispatch, and Fire departments socializing him with everyone that we can.

Officer Wurgler assures us that they are both excited to continue their training, strengthen their bond, and hit the ground running on the road to help out the other officers not only at our department but surrounding agencies as well.

So, welcome officer Ares! We look forward to watching you make a *paws-itive* impact on our community!

A WHOLE NEW VIEW

Last month, Mentor voters approved the construction of a 92-foot observation tower along the marsh rim approximately 1,000 ft north of the main trailhead at the Mentor Lagoons Nature Preserve.

UNDER CONSTRUCTION JUNE - AUGUST 2025

2025 ROAD PROGRAM – This annual program will resurface or repair approximately 42 asphalt and concrete streets throughout the City. In 2025, the City will invest roughly \$1.8 million in resurfacing and repairing local roads including: Snowberry Ct, Kellogg Creek, Justin Way, Bishop Ct, Filmore Ct, Cornwall Ct, Garden Ln, Katherine Ct, Leah Ct, Center St, Heisley Rd, and Munson Rd., Sandtree Ln., Cherrystone Dr., Omega Ct., Bernard Rd., Biltmore Rd., Foothill Dr., Curtis Ct., Beaver Creek Dr., Colony Ct., Edward St., Forestview Ave., Sharonlee Dr., Haverford Blvd., Bryson Dr., Kayne Dr., Campbell Rd., Tall Oaks Dr., Homewood Dr., South Shandle Blvd., Little Mountain Rd., Rosewood Lane., Garden Lane, Patterson Dr., Corduroy Rd, Hoose Rd., Cannon Ridge Dr., Mecantile Dr., N. Weatherby Dr., Brandywine Dr., and Lakeshore Blvd from Andrews Rd. to Willoughby.

SIDEWALK PROGRAM – This annual program will replace deficient concrete sidewalk slabs in Ward 4 (Zone D) through an assessment process that were not replaced by property owners as a result of 2024 inspections by the City. This zone consisted of 12.8 miles of sidewalk. The sidewalk inspections found roughly 1,800 slabs of sidewalk to be deficient and in need of repair or replacement. The remainder of the 2024 construction portion of the sidewalk program will also be competed in 2025 in Ward 1 (Zones D and E).

MENTOR LAGOONS MARINA BULKHEAD REPLACEMENT PHASE 6 - This project will repair and replace approximately 552-feet of bulkhead in the marina along E Dock with steel sheet piling and concrete walk at a cost of around \$500,000.

CIVIC CENTER POOL PARKING LOT - This project will construct a new 158-space asphalt parking lot just to the southeast of Civic Center Pool on Munson Road. The new lot is expected to cost around \$2,450,000.

CORDUROY ROAD RESURFACING - This project consists of milling and resurfacing the asphalt pavement on Corduroy Road from the south end of the causeway to Garden Lane. The total investment in this project is \$491,000, of which half will be covered by OPWC.

BELLFLOWER / MEADOWBROOK DITCH RESTORATION - This project will consist of clearing out fallen trees and debris as well as removing sediment that has built up in the ditch and the connecting storm sewer and restoring the ditch to its original design capacity. The total length of the ditch to be restored is 4,310 linear feet. The total investment in this project will be \$462,191.

Construction will begin later this year and it will be ready for use in 2026!

SUMMER STORMWATER SAFEGUARDS

It may surprise you to learn that everyday activities around your home can contribute to pollution and harmful algae growth in Lake Erie. Fertilizers, pesticides, yard waste, wastewater, and pet waste contain phosphorus and nitrogen, nutrients that fuel algae blooms. When these pollutants are left on the ground, rainwater washes them into storm sewers, which flow directly to Lake Erie without treatment. Excessive nutrients and pollutants from lawns and gardens can contaminate the

lake, harming fish and other aquatic life.

- To help protect our waterways and Lake Erie, follow these tips when working in your yard this summer:
- Use only the necessary amount of fertilizers and pesticides, and apply them when rain isn't forecast. Sweep up any excess from driveways or sidewalks.
- Properly dispose of or compost yard waste. Never dump it in storm drains, ditches, or streams.
- Ensure all household wastewater flows to your septic system or sanitary sewer. Never dump wastewater into waterways or storm drains.
- Pick up after your pets and dispose of their waste properly.

REPAIR – This project consists of removing and replacing concrete pavement on Mercantile Drive between Hamilton Drive and the new Mercantile Drive extension. The Total investment in the project is \$940,000 of which \$400,000 will be covered by OPWC.

HOOSE ROAD RESURFACING AND CANNON RIDGE DRIVE CONCRETE REPAIR – This project consists of milling and resurfacing asphalt pavement on Hoose Road from King Memorial Road to the Concord Township line to the east. This project also includes concrete pavement replacement on Cannon Ridge Drive from Hoose Road to Brayes Manor Drive. The

total investment in this project is \$668,000 of which \$300,000 is covered by OPWC.

TYLER BOULEVARD SIDEWALK – This project consists of installing concrete sidewalk from Hopkins Road to Heisley Road on the south side of Tyler Boulevard. The total investment in this project is \$562,000 of which \$416,000 is covered by a grant from Laketran.

BIG CHANGES AT CIVIC CENTER PARK

spring on a 42-foot-tall waterslide structure which will consist of 3 separate chutes. The waterslide portion of the project is expected to be completed sometime this summer.

Residents may have noticed trees being felled earlier this spring in front of the skatepark on Munson Road. This is the first step in the reimagining of Mentor's most popular park.

NEW BASKETBALL COURTS & PARKING LOT

Two new basketball courts and a 158-space parking lot will occupy the space where the skatepark currently sits. The current basketball court will be converted into 3 additional pickleball courts as well. Work on the parking lot is expected to be completed this summer.

NEW WATERSLIDES

Construction will begin this



NEW POOL COMPLEX Demolition of the buildings in the Civic Center Pool area will begin right after swim season is over this summer and will be replaced by a new series of inter-connected buildings with restrooms / locker area, concessions stand, a covered eating area, and more. Plans also include expansion of the pool pad and splash pad area.

All work is expected to be completed by the start of the 2026 swimming season and these improvements will serve Mentor residents for decades to come.
