LAZY G ALPACA RANCH - Nestled in a large grove of tree on the outskirts of Fremont, OH the Lazy G Alpaca Ranch is home to about 30 alpacas. Your guide will share a history of the alpaca, how the ranch became involved in raising them and the reasons for doing so.

The staff at this facility possesses a unique blend of knowledge of dog training with that of police work. WILD WILDLIFE REHABILITATION CENTER - This is one of the few centers in Ohio that is both federally and state licensed to accept injured and orphaned wildlife for the purpose of rehabilitation. Each year the center receives more than 2500 animals in need of help. Many are released back into their natural habitat. A few disabled animals become permanent residents who are used in educational program. Owls, flying squirrels, bald eagles, foxes, bobcats, hawks, waterfowl, amphibians, rabbits and deer are some of the animals visitors will see while visiting the center. Visitors learn the characteristics of each animal and how we can help to protect their natural habitat. In 2006, Mona Rutger, founder of the Center, was named Animal Planet’s HERO OF THE YEAR. The Center has been featured on Animal Planet many times.
