

AMERICA'S HEROES OF THE 21ST CENTURY
FLIGHT 93 - 09-11-01
QUECREEK MINE RESCUE
Wednesday, August 22

Somerset County, Pennsylvania has been called "America's county" because of the two life-changing events in which heroes lived and died in 2001 and 2002. We invite you to come and experience the places and hear the stories.

Leave around 6:30 AM

Arrive in Somerset 10:00 - 10:30 AM and meet a local guide.

This morning we will pay our respects at the Flight 93 Memorial.

Traveling to your next Heroes site, a stop is made at the Firehouse Bakery and Café where you may sample and purchase amazing baked good as well as other items.

Next, you will visit the Flight 93 Memorial Chapel which was dedicated on the first anniversary of 9/11 to honor God and the memory of the 40 heroes of Flight 93. Meet Father Mascherino, the founder of this non-denominational chapel and visit the Flight 93 Crew Monument in the garden area behind the chapel. Donated by United Airlines Flight Attendants Cause Foundation and dedicated on 09-11-2006, the monument entitled "Forever in Our Hearts" is a 16 ton black granite obelisk.

Lunch at Oakhurst Tea Room is a smorgasboard featuring soups, salads, hot foods, and desserts.

This afternoon your spirits will soar as you visit the Quecreek Mine Rescue Site where, on July 28th, 2002 nine miners were miraculously rescued from 240 feet beneath the earth in a farmer's field just outside of Somerset. Hear of the events from the time of the accident occurred until the last miner was brought up and you will understand that God was at work here. The rescue site has been developed into a beautiful garden and you will see the actual rescue capsule, the broken drill bit and more artifacts from this event.
