HEY...WHATCHA DUNE?

If you've visited Headlands Beach State Park this summer, you've no doubt noticed the construction equipment in the western boundary of the property and wondered what's going on.

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources is in the midst of replacing the frequently flooded parking lots with a coastal wetland dune / swale plant community.

Crews are removing approximately 7-acres of asphalt parking lots, moving sand to establish dunes and depressions, and planting native wetland species. Most work will be completed before winter 2022 with the planting of the wetland plants in spring 2023 by ODNR staff and volunteers. Native wetland species including seeds, plugs and trees will be planted to stabilize the soil and establish a coastal wetland dune/swale plant community.

The western portion of the park will resemble the dunes at the eastern end, providing migrating species an attractive stopover and further enhancing the importance of the area to migrating species.

This project is supported by a grant from the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative.

OPEN BURNING

Burning trash, brush, or leaves is not permitted in the City of Mentor. Small, attended campfires for cooking purposes are permitted during favorable weather conditions without prior approval. Bonfires require approval from the Fire Prevention Bureau by calling (440) 974-5768.

DEER SEASON

2022/2023 Deer Bow Hunting Permit Applications are available at the Mentor Municipal Center, or for download at cityofmentor.com/natural-resources. Hunting is only permitted on properties where the owner has granted permission. An archery proficiency test form must be returned with your application.

SLOW DOWN IN SCHOOL ZONES

Students are back in the classroom. and motorists need to exercise caution, especially in school zones. The Mentor Police Department reminds motorists to observe speed limits in school zones. The speed limit of 20 mph during the times school zones are active will be strictly enforced. Slow down and do your part to help keep Mentor students

FALL YARD WASTE


TURKEY ROLL ON ICE

LEARN TO SKATE

Skating is a lot of fun and it's a sport that can be enjoyed by all ages. Mastering skating skills provides a variety of benefits beyond the excitement of staying on your feet and gliding over the ice. Ice skating helps build muscle, is low-impact and easy on joints, and can boost balance, flexibility, quickness, and agility. These benefits are great for young children building small and large motor skills and even better for adults interested in burning calories and staying fit.

The Mentor Ice Arena offers lessons for youth and adults through the Learn to Skate USA Program. Whether you're enrolling a child to learn basics, or starting as an adult, you can rest assured that the skills you are learning and the lesson program is designed with the specific age and skill set of the students in mind. In fact, all instructors in the program, including our own Mentor Ice Arena Skating instructors, are held to the highest standards and certified to teach Learn to Skate USA skills.

The Learn to Skate USA program is endorsed by US Figure Skating, USA Hockey, and US Speedskating - creating a standardized nationwide program to teach basic skills. So, whatever ice sport you choose to pursue, the skills you learn in Mentor or anywhere across the country are the same.

At the Mentor Ice Arena, ice skating lessons are progressive in nature, meaning you start with the basics and build on fundamental skills. The program starts with Tot Learn to Skate - where children ages 3 to 5 learn to sit and stand up with skates - and advances to Basic 6 that focuses on turns, T-stops, and lunges.

Adult / teen classes are offered separately and cover all the basic skills taught to younger skaters but tailored to the abilities of older students.

The Learn to Skate USA program requires all students to be members of the organization. Annual memberships are valid July 1 through June 30 and cost \$17.25. Membership benefits include a welcome packet, subscription to Learn to Skate USA magazine, access to their member-specific app, and more.

NATURAL IS NICE

Our yards should be fun, beautiful, and relaxing right? But we want to protect our environment and keep it healthy for our families at the same

We should use water efficiently, reduce yard waste and reduce chemicals that can create an unhealthy environment by getting into our waterways. We can protect our rivers and Lake Erie if we conserve our precious water supply, reduce the need for chemicals, and recycle yard trimmings back onto our lawns.

Never dump yard waste along creeks and ravines. Also, try keeping your yards healthy by striving to:

- Create loose soil that allows air, water, and healthy root growth into the soil.
- Store water until the plants need it. Use a rain barrel to help save on water usage at the same time!
- Direct downspouts out into lawns and beds.
- Recycle nutrients for plants.

Compost or mulch helps our soils hold nutrients and water reducing the need for excessive amounts of fertilizers and watering. You can even make compost at home by using leaves, flowers and grass from your own yard. Keep the compost moist and you're on your way to creating beneficial soil life for your plants.

PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST SCAMS

Anyone can be the victim of a scam; however, senior citizens are more frequently targeted because they often have a higher accumulation of assets and tend to be more trusting of others than those in younger generations.

In our region, there are several common scams known to affect seniors, including the **lottery scam**, in which a fraudster tells you that you won a prize but need to pay a fee to collect your winnings; the **grandchild scam**, in which a fraudster identifies as your grandchild, says that they are in jail, and requests money for bail; and the **virus scam**, in which your computer prompts you to download antivirus software, and when you do, the program sends your personal information to a fraudster.

According to Officer Scott Bell of Mentor Police Department's Crime Prevention Unit, "all the usual scams, such as these, have been around for a while, but that doesn't make them any less threatening...seniors in our community need to stay vigilant."

The Crime Prevention Unit urges you to keep the following prevention tips in mind to protect yourself and your loved ones against scammers:

- Be suspicious of any unsolicited call or message. Ask yourself, if the message make sense before clicking on links or taking the desired action, especially when you are urged to act immediately.
- Check your accounts often. Regularly checking accounts will give you the chance to react quickly and report unusual activity.

 Verify Information with a trusted source. Never send personal information or money without

asking a trusted source to confirm any claims made by a potential scammer. If the claim sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

HONORING OUR VETERANS

Originally known as Armistice Day, the observance was first held November 11, 1919, marking the first anniversary of the end of World War I and honoring the heroism of those who died in the country's service. In 1954, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day – a national holiday celebrating all veterans.

The Mentor ceremony will take place at 11:11 AM at the Veterans Memorial located on the corner of Center Street and Civic Center Boulevard, adjacent to the Mentor Senior Center. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be moved inside the Mentor Senior Center.





FREE STREET TREES

The City of Mentor, with the help of the Mentor Tree Commission, manages a Street Tree program to promote the beautification of our streetscapes as well as help manage stormwater runoff. Each year, trees are available free-of-charge to Mentor residents on a first-come / first-served basis and are installed by city personnel in the public right-of-way. Once the tree is installed, care and maintenance of the new tree is the responsibility of the property owner.

Trees are planted in the Spring and the Fall. A tree of appropriate size for the homeowner's tree lawn is planted during the next planting session after the application is received. Please note that if you have a dead tree or stump on your tree lawn, it must be

removed by the homeowner before a new tree will be planted. Removal of any street tree requires a permit.

The benefits trees bring to urban environments are endless and include cooler temperatures, cleaner air, higher property values and healthier residents.

ROADS

I-90/SR 306 Bridge Deck Replacement

This project involves replacement of the deck on the SR-306 bridge over I-90 in Willoughby. This project is anticipated to be completed by

Brooksdale Road Reconstruction Project

Reconstruction of Brooksdale Road from Lake Overlook Drive to Woodridge Lane. This project is anticipated to be completed by late September.

Forest Road/Woodridge Lane Resurfacing

This project will provide full depth asphalt repairs, limited curb replacement and an asphalt overlay on Forest Road and Woodridge Lane. The project should be completed by November.

Market Street Rehab and Resurfacing

This project will repair concrete joints and resurface Market Street between Center Street and Munson Road. The project is anticipated to be completed by November.

2022 Mentor Facilities Resurfacing

This project will resurface the new recreation facility parking lot on Heisley Rd, pave four cemetery roads, resurface the multi-use path on Hopkins Road between Plains Road and Lakeshore Boulevard, and replace the Fire Station 5 driveway on Civic Center Blvd. Work is anticipated to be completed by September.

Hendricks Road Bridge Deck Replacement

This ODOT project is reconstructing the bridge deck on Hendricks Road over SR-2. Hendricks Road is currently closed at SR-2 with a posted detour of Hopkins Road to Tyler Boulevard to Heisley Road. Work is currently under way and is anticipated to be completed by the end of the year.

STORM DRAINAGE

Mentor Avenue Culvert Improvements

This project will repair two corrugated metal culverts under Mentor Avenue by the Great Lakes Mall. An existing sandstone headwall will also be repaired. Once repairs to the culvert are complete, pavement repairs and resurfacing of the westbound curb lane on Mentor Avenue over the culvert will be performed. The project is anticipated to begin late summer and be completed by late October.

FACILITIES

Mentor Marina Public Access Project

This project will construct approximately 430 feet of ADA accessible boardwalk along with an ADA accessible observation deck along the bank of the Mentor Marsh for visitors and nature enthusiasts to enjoy year-round. The boardwalk will be connected to the existing trail system providing an accessible loop which will connect to a future observation tower. The project is expected to be completed by November 2022.

MENTOR MARSH

Mentor Marsh Salt Fill Remediation

This project is currently underway and will remove approximately 200,000 cubic yards of salt fill and fly ash originally deposited in the marsh in the 1960s near SR-44 and Lakeshore Blvd. The project is being managed by the Ohio EPA and is expected to be completed by the end of the year.



MENTOR FIRE DEPARTMENT FALL SAFETY CHECK LIST

While house fires occur year-round, they're most common in the fall and winter. As temperatures drop and leaves fall, it's important to prepare your home for cold weather. Clip this handy list from the Mentor Fire Department.



Make sure your carbon monoxide detector is properly placed, has working batteries, and is not expired (most expire in 5-10 years and should have an expiration date on the unit).

Do a thorough clean-out of your dryer vent.

Exercise your main water shut-off. This will help ensure that the valve will operate if you need to shut the water off during an emergency or repair.

STOP MEANS STOP

You've no doubt seen numerous videos of careless drivers rolling past school buses with their lights flashing.

Mentor school buses are now equipped with cameras, enabling drivers

and police to track down drivers who ignore this important safety law.

There is simply no

excuse to drive past a school bus with its flashers on.

For the safety of our children, stop means stop! All it takes is one moment of lapsed judgment for tragedy to strike.

On roads with fewer than four lanes, all traffic

approaching a
school bus from
either direction
must stop at least10
feet from the bus
until the bus begins

to move or the driver

signals motorists to proceed.

On roads with four or more lanes, traffic traveling in the same direction as the school bus is required to stop.

Those who violate school bus traffic stop laws may receive a \$500 fine and could have their driver's license suspended.
