SPRING TIME FUN!

Winter is over and spring is just an egg hunt away! Hop into springtime with a City of Mentor Egg Hunt offered for both children and adults!

Glide in to the Mentor Ice Arena for the **Frost Bound Egg Hunt** on Saturday, March 28th from Noon to 1 PM. Hunt for eggs and paint the ice with colorful spring designs. Don't skate? Don't worry! The event just requires rubber soled shoes. Cost is just \$10 for residents, \$12 for nonresidents, and includes admission to the 1:30 PM Open Skate. Skate rental is available for \$3.

Hop over to the Mentor Civic Amphitheater on Saturday, April 4th at 11 AM for the **Springtime Egg Hunt for Kids**. This event is for children ages 2 to 10 years-old and features the floppy-eared harbinger of the season – the Easter Bunny. Meet and greet the big rabbit (and even get a picture or two), decorate a cookie, and then hunt for the over 1,000 eggs which he has "hidden" on the grounds. Children will be divided into age groups and are guaranteed at least 10 eggs each. Cost is \$10 for residents and \$12 for nonresidents.

And, why should kids have all the fun? The **Adult Flashlight Dash** is a chance for adults 21 and over to kick up their heels in a challenging all-out-sprint to collect great prizes at Black Brook Golf Course on Saturday April 4 at 7:30 PM. Armed with flashlights, participants will gather as many of the 4,000 eggs that are hidden in the dark as possible. Over 100 of the eggs contain prizes. Snacks are included and adult beverages are available for purchase. Cost is \$20 for residents and \$25 for nonresidents.

2020 Yard Waste Collection Program

Mentor's Yard Waste Collection Program begins April 6th. Residents can put out up to 12 units of yard waste each week on their regular collection day. A unit is a biodegradable bag or up to 32-gallon reusable container (marked YW) of grass clippings, trimmings twigs and leaves, or bundles of sticks (no more than 4 feet long and 3 inches in diameter). April 15th is the deadline to file City taxes. If you need assistance with your tax form, stop in at the RITA office located on the first floor of the Mentor Municipal Center. The Recreation Department will also be open for Pool Pass Sales on some evenings and weekends to accommodate customers not able come to the Recreation Department during normal business hours.

MAKE MENTOR COUNT

The US Census takes place every ten years in order to get an accurate count of the population. Participating in the census isn't just a chance to make a difference in our community, it's also the law.

When you respond to the census, you help ensure that Mentor gets its fair share of the more than \$675 billion per year in federal funds spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.

Results of the Census also help how determine how many seats each

state gets in Congress. State and local officials also use census counts to draw boundaries for congressional, state legislative, and school districts.

But that's not all; Businesses use census data to decide where to build factories, offices and stores, and this creates jobs. Developers use the census to build new homes and revitalize old neighborhoods. Local governments use the census for public safety and emergency preparedness. Residents use the census to support community initiatives involving legislation, quality-of-life and consumer advocacy.

In mid-March, homes across the nation will begin receiving invitations to complete the 2020 Census. Once your invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail.

GARAGE & YARD SALES

A permit is not required for a garage sale in the City of Mentor. There are a few things you need to know though. No more than 3 sales are permitted per property per calendar year, no sale can extend for more than 4 consecutive days, and hours limited to 9 AM to 7 PM.

Signs promoting the sale are permitted ONLY ON the property where the sale is being held. Signs are not permitted on street corners, tree lawns, or utility poles. Illegally posted signs will be confiscated without notice.

REMODELING? MAKE SURE YOUR CONTRACTOR IS REGISTERED!

Traditionally, Spring is a time when homeowners turn their attention to sprucing up and remodeling their homes. From a simple kitchen makeover to a more ambitious project that involves adding a room, it's more than likely you'll need a contractor. All contractors who work with the general public are required to register with the Mentor Building Department prior to performing any work within the City of Mentor*.

So if you're planning a project that involves a general contractor or a trade contractor to perform work such as plumbing, electrical, heating, ventilating and air conditioning, fire protection, right-of-way (such as site utilities or paving) or lawn sprinklers, make sure that they are registered.

According to Mentor's Chief Building Official, Jim Decker, checking to make sure your contractor is registered gives homeowners assurance that the job will comply with State of Ohio building codes as well as Mentor's Codes and Ordinances.

To that end, contractors must submit a registration bond to assure they will comply with the City's requirements.

"Additions and remodels are big undertakings. Our registration process helps to solidify the building code and

licensing laws of the State of Ohio. Registration provides an additional layer of protection for our residents," says Decker.

While a contractor may advertise that they are "bonded and insured," a bond is written for a specific purpose and may not protect the homeowner. Contractors must submit a registration bond on Mentor's Surety Bond Form to assure that they will comply with state and local codes and ordinances. The registration bond provided will be used if a contractor fails to correct a code violation identified by the City inspection staff during construction.

Additionally, specialty trade contractor must show proof of a license provided by the State of Ohio. All plumbing, electrical, HVAC and fire protection contractors must be licensed with the state.

No contractor should ever advise you to obtain a permit under your own name. The only reason to ever obtain a permit yourself is if you are performing the work yourself.

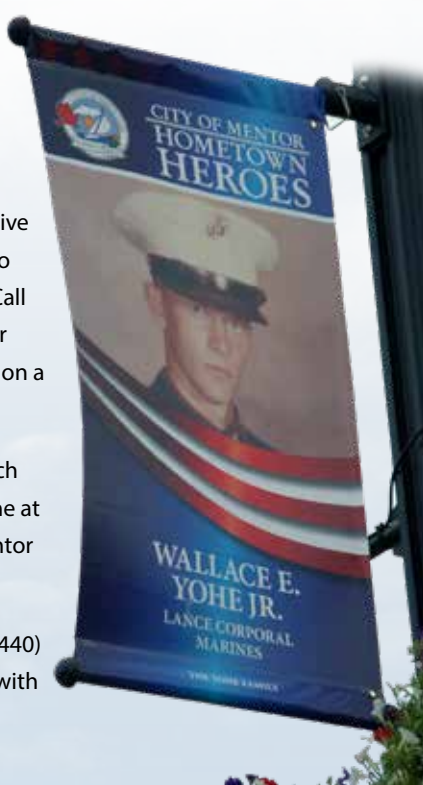

GET READY TO MOW

Several wastes can emerge from the ground, sidewalks, and driveways once the snow melts and the busy season begins. Do not let it all wash away with the next rainfall. Keep the runoff clean by following the steps below:

- Sweep up the leftover salt, dirt, litter, and pet waste that was left behind and properly dispose of it in the trash.
- Consider getting a soil test done to prevent over application of nutrients as well as save time and money. Test soil every 3 years in the spring or late fall. Kits are available at the Soil and Water Conservation District or Cooperative Extension Office.
- Lightly rake the lawn to remove compacted grass and snow mold that may have formed from excess moisture.
- If there is yard waste, leaves, and branches in your yard, start a compost pile with the first grass clippings of the season. Any clippings thereafter can be left on the lawn as a natural fertilizer.

- Use your waste pickup. Never dump waste at the banks of streams or in a storm sewer. This waste will clog the sewers and stream channels and is harmful to the fish and bugs living in the water.

Remember, storm water does not flow to a wastewater treatment plant like our household wastewater does. Anything flowing into the storm sewers and streams in our neighborhoods will wash directly to Lake Erie untreated. Help keep our waterways and Lake Erie Clean! UNDER CONSTRUCTION

MARCH – MAY 2020

Pedestrian Safety and Sidewalk Repair Program

This program will start in May, 2020 and will repair uneven and/or broken sidewalk slabs along the following streets: Agard Ct., Allen Troy Ct., Beechwood Dr., Blue Bell Ct., Bosley Cove, Brookside Cr., C J Ct., Daisy Ct., Dellhaven Ave., Diamond Centre Dr., Emerald Ct., Evergreen Dr., Freeport Ln., Gabriel Ct., Georgie Ct., Graystone Ln., Gregory Ct., Harborside Landing, Heisley Rd., Hopkins Rd., Hudson Ave., Jackie Ct., Kathleen Dr., LaSalle Ln., Longview Ave., Lori Jean Dr., Marion Dr., Matthew Ct., Mentor Ave., Michael Dr., Ocean Point, Omega Ct., Perennial Ln., Rockport Ln., Sugarbush Dr., and Whalers Cove. The project is scheduled to be complete by August 14, 2020.

SR 306 Bridge Repairs over SR 2

This project will repair existing guardrail, install new black vinyl coated fencing with the City of Mentor name and seal, and patch and seal the bridge parapets. Sidewalk and curb repair along with painting of the steel curb plate of the bridge will also be performed. Work is expected to begin in the spring with a scheduled completion date of June 26, 2020. Two way traffic will be maintained in each direction.

Tyler Blvd Roadway Rehabilitation

This project will provide for concrete repairs and an asphalt overlay of Tyler Blvd from Center Street to Heisley Road. The project is scheduled for primarily night work between the hours of 7PM and 7AM. Project will begin in the spring and be complete by August 30.

Belle Meadow Reconstruction

This project will reconstruct Belle Meadow from Woodridge to Lake Overlook. The project will include spot sanitary repairs, sanitary sewer lining, storm sewer lateral replacement and complete roadway reconstruction. Project will begin in April and be complete by the end of September.

2020 Road Repair Program

This project will provide concrete street repairs or asphalt overlay of 19 City streets. Streets included for concrete repairs include portions of Champaign, Demshar, Green Valley, Lakewood, Spring Blossom and St John. Streets included for asphalt overlay include portions of Acacia, Barbara, Broadmoor Circle, Esther, Hilltop, King Memorial, Lauren J, Maple, Maplewood, Melshore, Southwood and Willowbrook. Project will begin in the spring and be complete by August 21.
