A permit is not required for a garage sale; however, the City does not allow more than three sales at the same property in a calendar year. Hours for a yard or garage sale are limited to 9 AM to 7 PM and no sale can extend for more than four consecutive days. POOLS HOURS



GONATIVE!

There a lot of variables to consider when choosing plants for your yard including soil type, moisture, hardiness zone, amount of sunlight, color of the bloom, and maintenance requirements. One thing that is often overlooked is the origin of the species, is it native or is it non-native?

Native plants promote biodiversity and create food, shelter, and medicine for animals. Non-native species lack competitors and tend to create monocultures that choke out native species and eliminate the food source and shelter upon which so many species in our ecosystem are dependent upon.

The City of Mentor is distributing seed packets containing native plants such as Purple Coneflower, Ox-Eye Daisy, Black-Eyed Susan, and Butterfly Milkweed. These colorful wildflowers will brighten your garden as well as attract pollinators. If you are looking for shrubs or larger native plants, Northern Bayberry, Serviceberry, and Dogwood species are great landscape options that will attract birds.

PREVENTING ALGAL BLOOMS

Nutrient pollution is one of our most challenging environmental problems. Nitrogen and phosphorus make their way to Lake Erie from several sources. With the right conditions of nutrient rich runoff, warm water temperatures, and sunshine, a blue-green algae growth can cause Harmful Algal Blooms (HAB) that can produce toxins at high enough levels to be harmful to your health. The toxins can cause skin rash, blisters, hives, vomiting, and diarrhea.



Help prevent the HAB in Lake Erie by following these tips when performing your spring cleaning.

Don't overfertilize. Only use the necessary amount of fertilizer and apply when rain is not in the forecast. Sweep up any excess fertilizer from your driveway or sidewalk.

Properly dispose of grass clippings and leaves. Never dump yard waste in a storm drain, ditch, or along a stream.

Ensure that all wastewater is connected to your septic system or the sanitary sewer.

Always remember to pick up pet waste.

UNDERCONSTRUCTION

JUNE - AUGUST 2018

ROADS

Mentor Avenue Widening

This project will construct a left turn lane from Center Street to Hart Street along Mentor Avenue. Work is scheduled for completion by late summer 2018.

Marigold Reconstruction Project

This project will reconstruct Marigold Road from Woodridge Lane to Lake Overlook Drive. Work has is scheduled for completion by late 2018.

Hopkins Road Bridge Replacement

Lake County will replace the Hopkins Road Bridge over Martin Ohm Ditch located 0.35 miles north of Hendricks Road. Hopkins Road will be closed to through traffic in early May 2018 and is scheduled to reopen in October 2018.

Hoose Road Bridge Replacement

Lake County will replace the Hoose Road Bridge just east of King Memorial Road. Hoose Road will be closed and traffic detoured between May 28, 2018 and August 21, 2018.

Center Street – City Market Project

This project will construct a southbound right turn lane on Center Street to enter the new City Market site. Center Street will be resurfaced from SR 2 to Fracci Court. New traffic signals will be installed at the Tyler Boulevard and Center Street entrances to the City Market site. Utility relocation work will begin in the spring with construction scheduled to be complete by the end of 2018.

2018 Road Repair Program

This project will provide full depth concrete repairs or an asphalt overlay on portions of Brighton Road, Clover Avenue, Constantine Court, Corduroy Road, Corporate Boulevard, Crossfield Avenue, Elizabeth Court, Farnham Drive, Fracci Court, Hawk Avenue, Low Ridge Lane, Middlesex Road, Perkins Drive, Roosevelt Avenue, Rushton Drive, Sherwood Drive, S. Cedarwood, Steeplechase Drive, Thistlewood Drive, and S. Weatherby Drive. Construction will begin in the Spring with completion targeted by August.

SIDEWALK AND BIKEWAY

Pedestrian Safety Program

The City will begin sidewalk repairs in Zone 3A starting in the Spring of 2018. Zone 3A is bounded by Bellflower Road, SR 306, SR 2 and Independence Place Condos.

STORM DRAINAGE

Two Town Ditch Restoration

This project will restore approximately 2,700 lineal feet of existing stream bed and create approximately 900 lineal feet of intermittent stream between Bellflower Road and Jeremy Drive. Along with stream restoration, the project will construct new and enhanced wetland areas to promote water quality treatment and enhance stormwater detention.

Brighton Road Outfall Improvement

This project will replace a deteriorated 12-inch corrugated metal pipe stormwater outfall for Brighton Rd. and Headlands Rd. towards the Lake.

Stormwater Detention at Dale R. Rice School

This project will construct a dry stormwater detention basin located behind Dale R. Rice School.

PARKS

Springbrook Park

The City has started construction on Springbrook Park which will be located on the west side of Heisley Road between Mentor Avenue and Jackson Street. The scheduled completion date for this project is September 29, 2018.
