Mosquito Spraying

The Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) sprays most of the municipalities in Lake County to reduce the risk of mosquito borne diseases and to provide for a more comfortable summer environment. Garage Sales

A permit is not required for a garage sale, but the city does restrict where signs can be placed. Garage sale signs are permitted only on the property where the sale is being held. They may not be posted at the street corner, on tree lawns, or utility poles. Illegally posted signs may be confiscated by city staff without prior notice.

Grass and Weed Control

Lawns and landscaping should be maintained so as not to cause a negative effect on the neighborhood. Generally, grass in residential neighborhoods must be controlled in height or growth (under 8"). Property owners with excessively high grass or weeds will be given notice by Mentor's Code Enforcement Office and have 48 hours from receipt of notice to cut the high grass or remove the weeds. If the notices are ignored, legal action will be pursued for City crews to cut the grass at the owner's expense. Call 440-974-5740 with questions.

Open Burning

Burning yard waste is not permitted in the City. Small outdoor firepits/outdoor fireplaces are allowed but must not be used on an apartment balcony or within 10' of any structure. Recreational fires having a fuel area of 3' or less in diameter and 2' or less in height are permitted. No permit is required. Planning a bonfire (a fuel area of 3' or more in diameter)? You need a permit. To receive a bonfire permit, call the Fire Prevention Bureau at 440-974-5768 at least two business days before your planned bonfire.

Report all outages DIRECTLY to FirstEnergy at 888-544-4877. You may also report power outages online and even via text. Learn more at firstenergycorp.com/outages. Please do not call 911 unless you have an emergency

RV, Boat and Trailer Parking

RV's, boats and trailers of any kind may not be parked in front of the main structure. A minimum three-foot set back is required from side property lines. On corner lots, no RV, boat or trailer parking is permitted between the right-of-way and side of the main structure. Parking must be on an improved surface of concrete, asphalt or permeable pavers, and a permit is required for any type of driveway construction or expansion.

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS

The Mentor Senior Center will be celebrating their 50th Anniversary this year with a series of events including an open house on June 26, 2023.

The center was established in 1973 by a small group of citizens who recognized the need for a place in the community for seniors to gather and interact. There were other clubs at the time for various interests like gardening and arts and crafts, but none specifically for those aged 60 and older. The original club members met at Mentor Beach Park. Dues at the time were \$1 per year.

The club was small in those early days, but word of mouth quickly spread and it became apparent that they needed to look for a new location to accommodate their growth.

In the winter of 1977, the city purchased the old Ohio Bell building on Hart Street and remodeled it to become the new home of the Mentor Senior Center. The center continued to grow from there. It wasn't just a place to get a cup of coffee or play a game of cards anymore. Multiple arts and crafts and fitness classes were added. Several additions were added to the building as well but there was no real way to add any additional parking for their popular events. By the time the 2,000th member was registered, it was clear that a much larger facility was needed.

On November 6, 1991, Mentor City Council unanimously approved the purchase of the former Godfrey's restaurant on Center Street. Senior center members, city council, and administration worked with an architect to develop the concept of a new state-of-the-art facility. On April 29, 1993, a formal groundbreaking ceremony was held to mark the beginning of construction. Phase I consisted of refurbishing the existing building. Phase II, which began in late 1994, consisted of a 22,000 square foot addition.

The facility we know today opened to members on November 1, 1995, and features a community room, a lobby/lounge area, library, activity rooms, fitness area, game room, arts and crafts areas, and a stage.

And, it continues to grow! Today, nearly 5,000 members enjoy a wide array of programs and activities.

Many take advantage of fitness classes including low impact aerobics and strength training as well as health services and support groups. Others enjoy arts and crafts such as woodcarving, ceramics, painting, and knitting. Still others participate in computer and other tech help program.

And, there is also a nutritional benefit for joining the Senior Center as they offer made from scratch, hot meals every day.

For those who don't cook anymore, this service provides a homemade meal that they may not get otherwise.

In addition to all the wonderful activities located inside the Senior Center, one of the most popular programs is the Travel Program which offers as many as 100 trips a year, including day trips to casinos and theaters, as well as overnight trips to destinations such as the Finger Lakes and the Smoky Mountains.

Over the past 50 years, one of the keys to their success has always been to keep looking towards the future for their growth and expansion. The city of Mentor recently purchased the former nursery property on Munson Road adjacent to the facility with the intention of expanding parking.

The Mentor Senior Center has come a long way since 1973, and annual dues are still affordable at just \$10 per year for residents and \$15 per year for non-residents.

Thanks to the dozen members who had a vision 50 years ago and happy anniversary to the members who keep this a vibrant part of our community.

COMMUNITY RECREATION CENTER OPENS JULY 1

Anticipation has been steadily building around the opening of the new Mentor Community Recreation Center.

The City of Mentor purchased the Heisley Racquet & Fitness Club in December 2021. The 50-year-old facility was closed May of last year to undergo a transformative renovation to bring it to 21st century standards. The project consisted of updating all of the spaces as well as the addition of all new equipment. It was unfortunately beset by several delays due to supply-chain issues but the end is finally in sight.

Administration is pleased to announce that the MCRC will open to the public on July 1, 2023.

The 128,000 SF facility is one of the largest facilities of its kind in Northeast Ohio and includes an indoor soccer field, basketball, tennis, racquetball, and pickleball courts, indoor and outdoor swimming pools, cardiovascular and weight training areas, group exercise rooms, a childcare room, and other amenities.



Members can enjoy popular programs and activities including weight training, basketball, racquetball, pickleball, soccer, and tennis.

New additions include two new golf simulators, an open concept fitness center, two new basketball courts, an outdoor playground, and more!

Members can also enjoy a variety of year-round activities including aquatics, fitness and wellness, sports, infant and preschool, youth and teen, adult, older adult and family programs.

And, the center will accommodate sports leagues as well. Youth leagues include soccer, basketball, flag football and volleyball. Adult leagues include soccer, basketball, flag football, volleyball, kickball, tennis, racquetball and pickleball. All skill levels are welcome.

The new Community Room is the perfect space to host parties, corporate events, and more. The space can comfortably host mid-sized gatherings.



LOCK YOUR CAR DOORS

Now that warmer weather has arrived again, incidents of car thefts are expected to be on the rise. For several years, theft rings have been targeting neighborhoods by traveling in a transport vehicle and then canvassing the area for unlocked cars. In addition to the car and any valuables inside, they also look for garage door openers left inside vehicles to gain access to garages for additional vehicles or other valuables.

The common thread in all of these thefts is that they target unlocked vehicles and these incidents occur overnight.

Although Mentor is a very safe community to live in, we all should stay alert and take steps to protect ourselves and our property.

Lock Your Car Doors

The easiest thing you can do is lock your car door! Automobile theft is a crime of opportunity. If a thief finds that your car has been secured, they will likely move along to an easier target.

Don't Leave Your Keys in Your Car

Leaving keys and key fobs in your car not only make it easier to steal, but also provides an opportunity for thieves to access your home and other vehicles. Never leave your keys in your car.

Secure Your Valuables

Bring your valuables inside with you. If you leave them in your car, place them in your trunk, in your locked glove compartment or center console, or out of view so that they don't make attractive targets.

Lock Your Garage Entry Door

Thieves that gain access to your car can gain easy access to your garage and your home by utilizing your garage door opener. Be sure to lock the garage entrance to your home. While you're at it, also make sure all of your first-floor entry doors and windows are secured.

The Mentor Police Department and law enforcement agencies across the region are working together to break car theft rings.

In the meantime, let's do what we can to discourage this type of activity in our community by remaining aware and by locking our vehicles.

AT HOME POLLUTION PREVENTION

Rain is important for many reasons; replenishing drinking water supplies, recreational activities, and keeping healthy wildlife habitats to name a few. Problem can arise when it rains and pollutants from our daily activities enter the storm sewer system. Debris from our daily activities such as car maintenance, lawn care, and dog walking, can contribute to storm water pollution. Rain will wash away left behind debris from the surface of the ground, taking it directly to our creeks and streams and eventually to Lake Erie without being treated. Help prevent storm water pollution in Mentor:

Properly store and dispose of hazardous substances such as used oil, cleaning supplies and paint. Never pour them down any part of the storm sewer system and report anyone who does. Take advantage of the Lake County Hazardous Waste Collection Events this year at the Lake County Fairgrounds (June 10th and September 23rd). <https://www.lakecountyohio.gov/utilities/special-collections/>

Clean up any spills on your property immediately before the rain carries it away. Use rags or absorbents such as kitty litter and dispose of them in the garbage.

Clean up yard waste, leaves, and branches in your yard for proper disposal. Never dump along a waterway. Composting is a great alternative for garden lovers!

Consider installing innovative storm water practices, such as rain barrels or rain gardens to capture storm water and keep it on site. Your gardens will love the natural untreated water!

Pick up after your pets right away and dispose of their waste properly in secured containers.

Keep all waste stored under cover, or in leak proof containers with tight fitting lids if storing outdoors.

Use pesticides, fertilizers, and herbicides as instructed and sparingly to prevent excess runoff pollution.

Report any suspicious discharges to ditches, creeks or streams that may indicate a possible problem in the storm sewer system. <https://www.lcghd.org/contact-us/>

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

JUNE - AUGUST 2023

ANNUAL ROAD REPAIR PROGRAM

This project provides full depth concrete repairs or an asphalt overlay on portions of the following streets: Ashton Court, Aster Drive, Baythorne Drive, Belglo Lane, Briarwood Drive, Carpenter Drive, Chapelway Drive, Churchill Square, Hamilton Drive, Hayes Boulevard, Lucretia Court, Maiden Lane, Meldon Drive, Pepperwood Court, Presley Avenue, Prospect Street, Quail Point Lane, Robinwood Drive, Saddle Lane, Sea Pines, Sheltered Cove, St James Drive and Zinnia Court. Construction is underway and should be complete by August 2023.

CENTER STREET BRIDGE DECK REPLACEMENT

The Ohio Department of Transportation is replacing the SR 615 (Center Street) bridge deck over the railroad tracks. The project will require one lane of traffic in each direction while the bridge deck is replaced one half at a time. A total closure of the bridge can be expected the night of each concrete pour with a detour provided. The posted detour will utilize SR2, SR 306, and Mentor Avenue. Construction is underway with a scheduled late 2024 completion. It is anticipated that all lanes of traffic will reopen by the end of 2023, subject to construction material availability.

CHILLICOTHE ROAD RESURFACING

The project will resurface Chillicothe Road between Mentor Avenue and SR 84. In addition full depth asphalt repairs will occur. The project is anticipated to begin in late August with a late October completion.

GARFIELD / JACKSON RESURFACING

The project will resurface Garfield Road between SR 84 and the southern corporation limits and Jackson Street from Heisley Road to the eastern corporation limits. In addition, full depth asphalt repairs will occur. The project is anticipated to begin in late August with a late October completion.

HEISLEY ROAD RESURFACING

The project will resurface Heisley Road between Hendricks Road and SR 2. In addition full depth asphalt and concrete repairs will occur. The project is anticipated to begin in late August with a November completion.

MARINA ROADWAY MAINTENANCE

This project will rehabilitate selected roadways within the Mentor Lagoons Marina with a new double chip seal surface. Work should be completed by the end of June.

SIDEWALK & PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PROGRAM

Sidewalk replacement in Ward 4, Zone 4C is complete for 2023. However, the City will be inspecting 42 streets in Ward 1, Zones 1D & 1E for sidewalk deficiencies in 2023: The streets are Belvedere Dr., Brandywine Dr., Briarcliff Ct., Briarwood Dr., Brimfield Dr., Buena Vista Dr., Canterbury Ln., Carmen Pl., Carrington Dr., Cherrystone Dr., Cherrywood Dr., Chillicothe Rd., Colt Dr., Creekwood Dr., Crimson Ct., Demshar Dr., Forsythe Ln., Green Valley Dr., Highbridge Ct., Highland Ct., Hopkins Rd., Idlewood Dr., Julian Ct., King Memorial Rd., Mentor Ave., Musket Dr., Pratt Pl., Remington Dr., Ridgeside Dr., Sandbridge Ct., Sandtree Ln., Stonemill Dr., Sweet Hollow Dr., Sunrise Ct., Tamarin Ct., Tearose Dr., Terrace Park Dr., Timberidge Ct., Trask Tr., Trian Ct., Wayside Dr., and Wyant Dr. Refer to the city website for a map.

CHILLICOTHE / FAIRLAWN STORM SEWER IMPROVEMENT

This project will replace approximately 530 feet of 24" diameter storm sewer and replace it with 36" diameter storm sewer at the intersection of Chillicothe Rd. and Fairlawn Dr. Currently during heavy rains, flooding of the roadway at the Chillicothe/Fairlawn intersection occurs. The increased capacity of the storm sewer system will reduce the incidence of road flooding.

EDGEHILL RD. CULVERT REPLACEMENT & LAKESHORE BLVD. STORM SEWER IMPROVEMENT

This project will replace approximately 90 feet of culvert between 8812 and 8819 Edgehill Rd. The current culvert is deteriorating and is experiencing reduced capacity. The new culvert replacement will restore capacity to its original design. A second part of this project will replace approximately 640 feet of undersized storm sewer between Green Oak Ave. and Deerborn Ave. along Lakeshore Blvd. with new 12" diameter storm sewer for increased capacity.



GRILL SAFELY THIS SUMMER

Nothing says summer like the smell of barbecue wafting through our neighborhoods. The Mentor Fire Department wants to offer a couple of safe grilling tips.

According to the National Fire Protection Association, over 10,000 home fires per year are caused by grilling. Both charcoal and gas grills can cause significant damage to home and injuries to people if not used properly. Stay fire-safe this summer.

- Only use your grill outside and keep it 3 feet away from siding, deck rails, and eaves.
- Keep a 3 foot safety zone about your grill. This will keep kids and pets safe.
- Always open the lid of the grill before lighting.
- Don't leave a grill unattended. If you are cooking never walk away.
- Clean the grill after every use.
- If using a charcoal grill, place coals from the grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.

Keeping your grill in tip-top shape matters. Regularly inspect gas burners, lines, and connectors for damage or leaks. If you smell gas while cooking - turn your grill off immediately!

Cleaning your grill is important as well. Drippings from fatty meats and oils from marinades can build up and lead to a grease fire.

In case of a grease flareup, never use water to extinguish the flame. Grease fires must be smothered to be put out. If you are able, close the lid of the grill and turn off the heat source.

If the flames do not die down, it's always a good idea to have a fire extinguisher handy wherever you're cooking. Not all fire extinguishers are designed to put out grease fires.

Make sure the extinguisher is rated to fight gas, oil (Class B) or grease fires (Class K).

If you do have a fire emergency call 9-1-1. The Mentor Fire Department is available to help 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
