#### **Mosquito Spraying**

The Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) sprays most municipalities in Lake County to reduce the risk of mosquito borne diseases and provide a more comfortable summer environment. For more scheduled & additional information, contact their hotline, at 440-350-2088 or visit lcghd.org.

#### **Garage Sales**

A permit is not required for a garage sale, but the city does restrict where signs can be placed. Garage sale signs are permitted only on the property where the sale is being held. They may not be posted at the street corner, on tree lawns, or utility poles. Illegally posted signs may be confiscated by city staff without prior notice.

## **Grass and Weed Control**

Lawns and landscaping should be maintained so as not to cause a negative effect on the neighborhood. Generally, grass in residential neighborhoods must be controlled in height or growth (under 8"). Property owners with excessively high grass or weeds will be given notice by Mentor's Code Enforcement Office and have 48 hours from receipt of notice to cut the high grass or remove the weeds. If the notices are ignored, legal action will be pursued for City crews to cut the grass at the owner's expense. Call 440-974-5740 with questions.

## **Open Burning**

Burning yard waste is not permitted in the City. Small outdoor firepits/ outdoor fireplaces are allowed but must not be used on an apartment balcony or within 10' of any structure. Recreational fires having a fuel area of 3' or less in diameter and 2' or less in height are permitted. No permit is required. Planning a bonfire (a fuel area of 3' or more in diameter)? You need a permit. To receive a bonfire permit, call the Fire Prevention Bureau at 440-974-5768 at least two business days before your planned bonfire.

The Mentor Fire Department goes a step further by offering free installation services for those who are unable to install smoke detectors themselves. Ensuring proper installation is crucial for effective fire safety.

# **HAVE YOU HEARD OF THE 9 PM ROUTINE?**

The 9 PM Routine is a simple yet effective practice that encourages residents to establish a nighttime routine focused on safety and security.

Theft can happen anywhere at any time. While Mentor is a safe community, the police department encourages residents to do what they can to protect themselves against theft. Simply set a reminder at 9 PM to do the following:

**Lock Your Doors:** Ensure that all exterior doors, including your front door, back door, and garage door, are securely locked. This helps prevent unauthorized entry into your home.

**Close Your Garage:** If you have a garage, close it before bedtime. An open garage is an invitation for theft or unwanted access.

#### **Secure Valuables in Your Car:**

Remove any valuable items from your car and lock it. Don't leave purses, electronics, or other valuable belongings visible through the windows. In 2023, Mentor Police responded to 45 theft-from-vehicle calls – in most cases, vehicles were left unlocked.

#### **Activate Alarms and Security**

**Systems:** If you have a home security system, make sure it is armed. Activate alarms, motion sensors, and any other security features you have in place. If you haven't invested in a video surveillance system, consider doing so. There are several inexpensive systems available on the market with motion activated cameras that save video directly to the cloud

It's no secret that thieves look for easy targets. By incorporating these simple steps into your nightly routine, you can make a big difference in protecting your home and belongings and reduce the risk of preventable crime.

# SIGNS OF THE TIMES

Election season will soon be in full swing and the City has received a number of inquiries related to what is and what isn't permitted related to political yard signs. The City's sign ordinances allow for the following:

- One ground sign per development unit (your yard) may be displayed year-round.
- During the election cycle, additional ground signs are permitted up to, but not more than, the total number of candidates and ballot issues for which a voter in the City may cast a ballot.
- Yard signs are limited to a maximum of 15 square feet.
- Yard signs may not be illuminated.
- No signs are permitted to be placed in the public right of way, including tree lawns.
- Signs cannot be posted within 15 feet of a side lot line.
- Temporary signs are not permitted on commercial properties where a ground sign already exists.

Sign content is protected under the First Amendment. Although a message may be considered disagreeable, it is a matter of free speech. Signs are also considered personal property. Trespassing, as well as theft and/or destruction of yard signs are punishable offenses.

Let's continue to respect each other's right to free speech as well as property for the duration of this election season.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL CARE IN WASTE REMOVAL**

Did you know it only takes a quart of motor oil from your car to make an oil slick many acres in size?

Anything rinsed from a garage floor or driveway, or dump down a storm drain will flow to Lake Erie untreated and can be harmful to the aquatic life that lives there.

To prevent that rainbow sheen in the creek near your house, always properly dispose of used motor oil, never dump oil in a storm drain, and fix any leaks on your car. Also, use absorbents like rags or kitty litter to soak up any leaks and spills before the rain carries it away. Check with our area auto part stores to accept your used motor oil for disposal.

Other chemicals like left-over solvents, pesticides, and paints can be taken to the Lake County Fairgrounds in June 1st and September 21st during the 2024 Lake County Solid Waste District Special Collection Event. Learn more at lakecountyohio.gov/utilities/special-collections.

# **UNDER**CONSTRUCTION

# **JUNE - AUGUST 2024**

#### **2024 ROAD PROGRAM**

This annual program will resurface or repair approximately 20 asphalt and concrete neighborhood streets throughout the City. In 2024, the City will invest roughly \$1.5 million in resurfacing and repairing local roads.

#### **2024 SIDEWALK PROGRAM**

This annual program will replace deficient concrete sidewalk slabs in Ward 1 (Zones D and E) through an assessment process that were not replaced by property owners as a result of 2023 inspections by the City. These zones consisted of 17.6 miles of sidewalk. The sidewalk inspections found roughly 2,300 slabs of sidewalk to be deficient and in need of repair or replacement.

# MENTOR LAGOONS MARINA BULKHEAD REPLACEMENT PHASE 5

This project will repair and replace approximately 600-feet of bulkhead in the marina along D Dock with steel sheet piling and concrete walk at a cost of around \$600,000.

#### **SENIOR CENTER PARKING LOT**

This project will construct a new 90-space asphalt parking lot just to the north of the existing parking lot connecting to Munson Road. The new lot will roughly double the amount of parking at the Senior Center and is expected to cost around \$1,500,000.

### **EDGEHILL ROAD CULVERT REPLACEMENT**

This project will replace an existing 42" diameter deteriorating steel culvert with a new 42" diameter high density polyethylene corrugated culvert and install concrete headwalls.

### **LAKESHORE BLVD. STORM SEWER**

This project will replace approximately 600-feet of undersized storm sewer on the south side of Lakeshore Boulevard from Green Oak Drive to Dearborn Road with 12" pipe.

# CENTER STREET BRIDGE DECK

ODOT will continue to work on the underside of the project in 2024. Work will mostly be confined to under the bridge and includes steel beam painting. Traffic on Center Street should not be impacted.

## MARINA PAVER PARKING LOT

At a cost of around \$550,000, this project consists of installing a 16,000 square foot permeable paver parking lot at the Mentor Marina accommodating 22 boat trailers. In addition to the pavers, vegetated buffers will be installed and the existing bioswale by the office/storage building will be restored. The City recieved \$270,594 in financial assistance from the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation towards this project.

## NORTON ESTATE STREAM RESTORATION

This project consists of rerouting a section of stream around an existing dam that is no longer structurally sound. This project will also restore hundreds of feet of stream downstream of the dam that has encountered elevated levels of erosion. The total cost of this project is \$366,000 which is primarily funded through a grant received with the help of Chagrin River Watershed Partners.

## HOPKINS ROAD RESURFACING

This project consists of milling and resurfacing the asphalt pavement on Hopkins Road from Plains Road to Lakeshore Boulevard. The total investment in this project is \$468,000 of which half will be covered by OPWC.

## MENTOR MARINA DOCK ROAD

This project consists of rehabbing the access roads for D and E Docks as well as the front entrance area of the Marina. The method of rehabilitation will be a double chip seal as well as the addition of stone base in certain areas. The total investment in Marina Road Rehabilitation will be about \$225,000.

Nothing says summer like the smell of barbecue wafting through our neighborhoods. The Mentor Fire Department wants to offer a couple of safe grilling tips.

According to the National Fire Protection Association, over 10,000 home fires per year are caused by grilling. Both charcoal and gas grills can cause significant damage to home and injuries to people if not used properly. Stay fire-safe this summer.

- Only use your grill outside and keep it 3 feet away from siding, deck rails, and eaves.
- Keep a 3 foot safety zone about your grill. This will keep kids and pets safe.
- Always open the lid of the

- grill before lighting.
- Don't leave a grill unattended. If you are cooking never walk away.
- Clean the grill after every
- If using a charcoal grill, place coals from the grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.

Keeping your grill in tip-top shape matters. Regularly inspect gas burners, lines, and connectors for damage or leaks. If you smell gas while cooking - turn your grill off immediately!

Cleaning your grill is important as well. Drippings from fatty meats and oils from marinades can build up and lead to a grease fire.

In case of a grease flareup, never use water to extinguish the flame. Grease fires must be smothered to be put out. If you are able, close the lid of the grill and turn off the heat source.

If the flames do not die down, it's always a good idea to have a fire extinguisher handy wherever you're cooking. Not all fire extinguishers are designed to put out grease fires.

Make sure the extinguisher is rated to fight gas, oil (Class B) or grease fires (Class K).

If you do have a fire emergency call 9-1-1. The Mentor Fire Department is available to help 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

# FIREWORKS REMINDER

ndependence Day is fast approachin and our community will celebrate with family, friends, and food. However, some will choose to use fireworks during their celebrations. In 2022 the state of Ohio legalized the possession and discharge of fireworks, but it was left to each city to determine if it would be permitted in their community. The city of Mentor decided not to allow the sale or discharge of fireworks at any time during the year. A violation of the city fireworks ordinance is a fourth-degree misdemeanor.

The Mentor Police Department encourages everyone to have a fun and safe Fourth of July but to leave the fireworks out of your home celebration. Instead, join your friends & neighbors at the fireworks display at Civic Center Park.
