CONCERNED ABOUT COYOTES?

Once somewhat rare in our area, an increasing number of coyotes have been spotted in Mentor over the past few years. The Ohio Department of Natural Resources reports that coyotes are present in all 88 Ohio counties. Coyotes are naturally timid creatures. Seeing them or hearing them howl is not a cause for concern. However, there are a few tips you'll want to keep in mind if you encounter a coyote.

What is considered natural coyote behavior?

Coyotes are active day and night. They are omnivores, eating primarily rodents as well as insects, fruits, and vegetation. Hunting is a natural behavior and it is normal for a coyote to take advantage of any opportunity to eat. If you have coyotes in your area, to minimize the potential for conflict it's important to keep small pets on a leash, and monitor them outside, especially around dawn and dusk. It's also important to keep any food source, such as trash or pet food, secured.

What is considered abnormal coyote behavior?

Being approached or followed by a coyote, or a coyote directly entering your path is abnormal and should be reported.

Habituation can occur when people feed coyotes, consciously or by accident, by leaving food sources in their yard. Coyotes learn to associate people with being fed and become less afraid of them. Coyotes typically give birth to pups between April and May, so their protective instincts may be higher during this period.



What should I do if a coyote approaches me?

If walking with a pet, do not release them from their leash; keep them under control the best you can. A coyote will likely view a dog as a threat. Attempt to startle the coyote by waving your arms, yelling in a deep voice, and trying to appear as large as possible. If the coyote does not run away in response, continue hazing behaviors and back away from the coyote. Do not turn your back or run.

KEEPIN'YOU MOVIN'

Keeping the roadways clear of ice and snow is an important job and the City of Mentor's Public Works Department works hard to keep motorists safe and on the road.

During a snow storm, plows focus initially on the main roads to benefit the greatest number of motorists. Once the main roads are cleared and salted, side streets and cul-de-sacs are plowed. The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining approximately 500 lane miles of roadway, utilizing 15 – 20 plows for a routine snowfall, and as many as 40 trucks during a major snow event.

Our drivers have an important job to do and they take great pride in their snow removal efforts. In turn, motorists can do their part by giving themselves extra time to reach their destination and driving slowly and with greater caution when the snow flies.

GET READY FOR WINTER

We all know the weather in Northeast Ohio can be unpredictable. Being prepared for an emergency an take some of the worry out of winter weather.

You may lose electricity and heat for several hours during a winter storm. Take the time to create an emergency plan and preparedness kit to help you make it through.

Here are some Winter Storm Preparedness tips from the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

BEFORE

- Create and test an emergency communication plan.
- Stock emergency supplies and install battery-powered or battery backed-up carbon monoxide detectors and smoke detectors.
- Identify a place nearby where you can safely warm up should you lose heat in your home.

DURING

- Stay indoors and off the roads. If you must drive, keep emergency supplies in your car.
- Close off rooms to consolidate and retain heat.
- Dress in layers and use blankets to stay warm.
- Never use a generator, camp stove, charcoal grill, or gasoline or propane heater indoors, as these items can start accidental fires, cause electric shock, and/or cause deadly carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Never heat a home with a cooktop or oven.
- Monitor local news and alerts for emergency information and instructions.

Remember to only call 911 if you have an actual emergency during the Winter Storm event. You may report power outages to The Illumination Company by calling 888-LIGHTSS (888-544-4877) or online at firstenergycorp.com/outages.

RESIDENT WELL CHECK

For residents with special medical needs, transportation and/or communication issues, or no nearby friends or relatives that they can count on to check on them during extended power outages. Call 440-974-5762 to register.

RESIDENTIAL LOCKBOX PROGRAM

Recommended for senior citizens and disabled residents. The Residential Lock Box Program enables Fire/EMS/Police to gain access to your home if you are unable to open the door. One-time \$35 installation fee. For additional information, call 440-974-5768.

SENIOR BLOOD PRESSURE CHECK

Residents may stop in at any Mentor fire station for a free blood pressure check. If you are physically unable to get to a fire station, call 440-974-5765 to request a home blood pressure check.

SMOKE DETECTOR PROGRAM

A program for Seniors, the disabled, or those who cannot afford smoke detectors. If your smoke detectors are over ten years-old, the Fire Department will install new smoke detectors with a 10-year battery with photoelectric sensors at no cost to qualifying residents. Call 440-974-5768 for details.

Think that candy wrapper won't make a difference? Think again. Plastic wrappers, bottles, cigarette butts, paper containers, Christmas Tree tinsel, and other trash can make their way into storm drains and directly into our waterways untreated.

HELP KEEP MENTOR...

This past fall, 40 volunteers collected over 900 pounds of trash along the beach during a cleanup effort at the Mentor Lagoons Nature Preserve. Trash is not just an eyesore along streets, parks and waterways in our community, it can negatively impact wildlife and poses hazards for fisherman and boaters.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Items that top the list at beach cleanups locally and worldwide are pieces of plastic, cigar tips, and cigarette filters. (Ocean Conservancy)
- Cigarette filters/butts are NOT biodegradable. The acetate filters take years to decompose, and the toxic chemicals trapped in the filters can leach into aquatic ecosystems.
- Plastics break down into tiny pieces called microplastics in water, then release toxic chemicals which are consumed by fish, birds, snakes, and other wildlife.
- It can take 600 years for plastic monofilament fishing line to decompose.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- Don't overfill trash cans on windy days and always provide tight fitting lids during outdoor storage especially in the winter.
- Do Not Litter! Lake Erie is our source of drinking water. We need to do our part to prevent pollution as well as educate others.
- Follow the 3R's (REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE) wherever possible.
- Use reusable shopping bags instead of the plastic bags handed out at the store.
- If you see illegal dumping, notify local authorities immediately.
