# TAKE A WINTER HIKE

Experience the Mentor park trails in winter. The sounds your footsteps make as you crunch through the snow. The sunlight as it is filtered through the bare trees. The hush of a winter afternoon broken occasionally by the call of a bird. Look for the tracks of the animals that live in the park. Feel the bite of the wind sting your cheeks.

Winter is a special time to explore Mentor's 1,200 acres of parkland and our surrounding natural areas. From easy paved walkways to challenging trails, Mentor city parks offer plenty of opportunities for both the casual walker and avid hiker to connect with nature in the colder months.

If you are looking for a quick, less strenuous winter walk visit Edward R. Walsh Park or Springbrook Gardens Park - both of which feature paved walking paths. Walsh's 1.5 mile walkway skirts the park's perimeter, winding through a short, wooded area and then past the fishing pond. The park is perfect for a family walk. Not only do the snow-covered soccer fields offer plenty of space to frolic, but the playground area is open all year long and offers a chance to expend excess energy from being cooped up inside.

Similarly, Springbrook Gardens Park, features 1.7 miles of paved walking paths including an all-access boardwalk that offers views of the large pond. The former nursery land has been transformed to a prairie brimming with native plants. The restored stream bed provides a greater habitat for birds and wildlife. Keep your eyes open for a great blue heron and other birds and animals which have repopulated the area.

More challenging terrain can be found at the Mentor Lagoons Nature Preserve. Over three miles of hiking trails encircle the Mentor Lagoons Nature Preserve providing four distinctly different vistas: a view of the Mentor Lagoons Marina, Mentor Marsh, upland forest, and Lake Erie shoreline.

Vere off the main trail and catch the Marsh Rim trail that leads though upland forest along the Mentor Marsh's western edge. Without the leaves on the trees, hikers have an expansive view of the marsh. The milelong trail connects with the Overlook trail with views and access to Lake Erie.

The Zimmerman Trail can be accessed from Morton Community Park. This trail is part of the Mentor Marsh State Nature Preserve and follows the north edge of the Mentor Marsh. The two-mile hike (four miles round trip) leads hikers through an upland and swamp forest. The trail crosses streams and shallow ravines leading to a small parking area on Headlands Road. Along the way, are plenty of opportunities to encounter wildlife and enjoy views of the marsh.

Mentor's park trails as well as the Mentor Marsh State Nature Preserve trails are open dawn-to-dusk all year long. We invite you to get outdoors and experience the beauty of season with a winter hike.

# **HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS**

The holidays are a time for families and friends to gather together, but it's also a time of increased risk of fire. It may surprise you to learn that over 33% of decoration fires are started by candles and nearly 33% of Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.

The Mentor Fire Department offers a few simple tips to ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

- · Choose holiday decorations that are flame resistant or retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other potentially flammable items. Keep children and pets away from lit candles. Extinguish candles when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both. Replace any string lights with worn or broken cords, or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for the number of light strands you

can connect. Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so cords don't get damaged. Turn off all string lights and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched. Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents, or lights. Add water to the tree stand daily. Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it's dry. Dried-out trees should not be left in the home or garage.
  - Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop. Keep pot handles turned to the side or the back so children cannot pull them down.

# WINTER REMINDERS

A Northeast Ohio winter is sure to bring snow and ice. On average, over 45 inches of snow falls in our city every winter. Keeping up with the falling snow is a team effort. The City of Mentor Public Works Department works hard to keep Mentor roads clear and Mentor property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks clear for pedestrians. Here are a few winter reminders for the upcoming snowy season:

## MENTOR SNOWPLOWS

During a snowstorm, City of Mentor snowplows focus on the main roads to benefit the greatest number of motorists. Once the main roads are cleared and salted, side streets and cul-de-sacs are plowed.

## PRACTICE SAFE WINTER DRIVING

If the snow is falling and you need to drive, give yourself extra time to reach your destination and slow down. Always adjust your speed to account for lower traction when driving on snow covered or icy roads. During a major snowstorm stay home if possible.

## **KEEP FIRE HYDRANTS CLEAR**

Residents and business owners are urged to assist the Fire Department by keeping clear access to their

fire hydrants during heavy snowfalls. Shovel around your hydrant and be ready if an emergency occurs.

## NO PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCY

A Snow Emergency is defined as that time when there has been an accumulation of snow, sleet, hail, or ice on any streets or roads. No parking is permitted on any city street during a Snow Emergency to allow plows to clear the streets. A Parking Ban is automatically in effect when a snowstorm occurs. Reminders are posted on City of Mentor's Facebook and Twitter.

## **KEEP YOUR SIDEWALKS CLEAR**

It is the responsibility of the property owner or occupant to keep sidewalks in front of their property clear of ice and snow. In addition, pushing snow or ice onto a public sidewalk or roadway is prohibited. If you have contracted with a plow company to clear your driveway, please remind them that snow plowed from your driveway must be piled on your property.



Rates include use of chairs and banquet tables (indoor use only). A refundable security deposit is required when renting any of our facilities.

For parties serving alcohol, an offduty Mentor police officer must be contracted by the renter to provide security and a larger security deposit is required. The renter must also purchase an alcohol permit.

And for summer parties, how about a Mentor park?

The City of Mentor has three picnic pavilions that can be rented by your group or organization. Each pavilion includes picnic tables, grills and nearby playground areas. Picnic Pavilions are rented in 6-hour increments or for the entire day.

# WASTE UPDATES

Important information for Mentor residents who receive curbside waste & recycling service through Waste Management.

## YARD WASTE PROGRAM

The 2022 Yard Waste Collection Program ends the week of December 12th. Residents with service through Waste Management can still set out 25 bags or bundles of yard waste through that week. The curbside collection will resume in April 2023.

## WALK UP SERVICE

Walk-up service is available for residents who are physically unable to move their garbage container and recycling container to the curbside on their waste collection day. This program applies only to the garbage container and the recycling container. It does not apply to bulk items and yard waste. The container(s) must be readily accessible to the Waste Management employee and must be within 75' of the curb and must be outside of any garage or other structure. Registration is required.

## **ONLINE ACCOUNT MANAGEMENT**

Waste Management has a new digital service platform to better service the residents of Mentor.

Access My WM anytime, anywhere, and on any device to pay bills, access pickup and holiday schedules, enroll in paperless billing, and set notification preferences in case of delay in pickup.

Municipal income taxes account for over 66% of the City's annual budget which is why shopping local makes so much sense.



# **KEEP LITTER FROM OUR LAKE**





SMARTPHONE CAME

When trash - such as plastic wrappers, bottles, cigarette butts, paper containers, etc. - is dropped on the ground, it can make its way into storm drains and directly into our waterways untreated. Trash is not just an eyesore along streets, parks and waterways in our community, it can negatively impact wildlife and present hazards for fisherman and boaters.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- Items that are continually at the top of the list of trash found at beach cleanups locally and worldwide are, plastic, cigar tips and cigarette filters. (Ocean Conservancy)
- Cigarette filter/butts are NOT biodegradable. The acetate filters take years to decompose, and the toxic chemicals trapped in the filters can leak into aquatic ecosystems, threatening our water resources.
- Plastics break down into tiny pieces called micro plastics in water, then release toxic chemicals swallowed by fish, birds, snakes, and other wildlife.
- It can take 600 years for plastic monofilament fishing line to decompose.

### WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Don't litter! Lake Erie is our source of drinking water.
  We need to do our part to prevent pollution and to educate others to not litter.
- Follow the 3R's (REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE) wherever possible.
- Use reusable shopping bags instead of the plastic bags handed out at the store.
- Don't overfill trash cans on windy days and always provide tight fitting lids during outdoor storage.
- If you see illegal dumping notify the local authorities.

## **PROTECT YOURSELF FROM PORCH PIRATES**

Although consumers are always encouraged to shop local when they can, online sales are expected to be at or near all-time highs again this holiday season. With this increase in purchases and deliveries, experts expect to see an increase in porch piracy as well...but we're fighting back.

The Mentor Police Department has formed a special undercover detail to combat porch pirates. Officers will be operating throughout city neighborhoods utilizing a variety of tools including unmarked vehicles, surveillance equipment, and the use of bait boxes that contain GPS tracking units.

Porch piracy is a crime of opportunity. Thieves will often follow a delivery truck or simply cruise around an area looking for an attractive target. And, they are looking for high value items that they can flip quickly. Mentor Police are doing what they can, but residents are reminded that taking precautionary steps to protect themselves is the first line of defense. Track your online orders, remove them from your porch as soon as they are delivered, and invest in security cameras. Finally, be a good neighbor and keep an eye out for each other. If you see a suspicious car, or a theft in progress, jot down the license plate and contact the police. A description of a suspect or their vehicle, a partial license plate, stolen property, and other factors can lead to arrest. Those convicted of misdemeanor theft in the City of Mentor can face up to six-months in jail, even for a first offense.
