RE: Arts Programming Support Request - Headlands Beach State Park - July 26, 2014

Members of the OAC Program Support Grant Review Committee:

As we did last year, we are writing again to express our enthusiastic participation and support of Lake Metroparks for the Headlands Beachfest event on July 26, 2014. A similar letter of support was sent last year and we believe the 2013 Beachfest was a very successful event, even in the face of some challenging weather.

Lake Metroparks was formed in 1958 under the authority of Chapter 1545 of the Ohio Revised Code and is a separate political subdivision of the state of Ohio. The park district encompasses a total of 37 parks and 8,700 acres. Its boundaries are coterminous with the boundaries of Lake County, Ohio, located immediately east of Cuyahoga County. Our mission is to continue to provide the citizens of Lake County and the broader region with the clean, safe and outstanding parks and outdoor education programming that they have come to expect from their Lake Metroparks.

The southern shoreline of Lake Erie forms the northern boundary of our park district, and as such we look for ways to promote Lake Erie and this county's relationship with the Lake. Our organization manages and maintains several lakefront sites, including the Fairport Harbor beach, an immediate neighbor of Headlands Beach State Park. Our staff are always looking for new ways and creating new opportunities for people to enjoy their parks. Headlands Beachfest represents an excellent opportunity for Lake Metroparks to collaborate with our counterparts at the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, the City of Mentor, and other partners, to create a new outdoor experience for visitors to the area.

As we did last year, Lake Metroparks will be providing staff and logistics support for the Headlands Beachfest event. In-kind support will include the service of Lake Metroparks programmers, arts projects with a natural theme, watercraft safety demonstrations, and basic kayak instruction. The in-kind labor and equipment for Lake Metroparks involvement is estimated to be in the amount of one thousand eight hundred and eighty dollars.

We sincerely encourage you to support the efforts of the City of Mentor to continue this great summer event that we believe will continue to grow into one of the premier beach events on the Great Lakes.

Headlands BeachFest at the Headlands Beach State Park is one of those long overdue concepts becoming a reality. Having grown up spending my summer days at Ashtabula Ohio's Walnut Beach, I first acquired a deep love for the beach. That grew through adult years as my communications career allowed me to enjoy beaches in Delaware, New Jersey, the Outer Banks, Hilton Head, San Diego, Florida's East Coast and, among my favorites, Florida's Gulf Coasts.

There's no question that waterfront properties and beach access are more readily available for those with more money. It's part of our reality. Yet, in Ohio, we know that beach fun is widely accessible through Lake Erie's expansive beaches like the Mentor Headlands. Headlands BeachFest gives us an opportunity to celebrate our Ohio beaches through a well organized community festival that maximizes our enjoyment by showing us how to create art out of many things - including sand. The event exposes visitors to a variety of visual and performance arts and offers multiple opportunities for an unsuspecting audience to participate and celebrate art at the beach.
